



DISMISSAL

DISMISSAL TIMES

- Teachers will escort all students out their designated exit door at 2:53 p.m. (See Exceptions)
- All students must go directly home, to daycare, or to a school sanctioned activity after dismissal.
- Campus (including playground) is closed until 6:00 p.m. except for use with school activities or CLC services.

DISMISSAL AREAS

- Students participating in CLC will meet staff in the classroom hallway.
- Participants in school sponsored activities will meet their supervisor at a designated door.
- Parents should arrange to pick up their child(ren) outside at the same location each day.
- Students will not be allowed to play on the playground while waiting for rides after school.

DROP OFF AND PICK UP

- USE CROSSWALKS AT ALL TIMES.
- To ensure children do not cross in the street, pick up and drop off your child(ren) on the passenger side of the car.
- Follow flow of traffic when dropping off and picking up your child(ren). (See map insert)

- Do not use the parking lot or the bus loading zone to drop off or pick up your child(ren).
- Students plan to meet each other outside the building.
- Older students go to meet younger siblings at their designated door.



STUDENT USE OF TELEPHONE

Students will be permitted to call home regarding school matters after getting permission from the classroom teacher. Calls by students must be kept to a minimum, as there are a very limited number of phone lines in and out of school. Students are asked to make arrangements for participating in afterschool activities or going home with a friend before arriving at school. Cell phones and other electronic devices have been found to be disruptive to learning. If a student brings them to school they must remain in the child's backpack or must be handed into the Teacher. If the student takes an electronic device out during the school day, it will be kept in the office or must be handed into the Teacher until a parent/quardian can pick it up.

METHODS OF COMMUNICATION

SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

The Pershing newsletter contains announcements, information, school events, etc. This newsletter is sent monthly through (SchoolMessenger email).

WEEKLY COMMUNICATION FOLDERS

Typically, school news will be sent home via Thursday folders. Please return the folder the next day including any notes to your child's teacher. General information will be sent with the oldest child in the family attending Pershing School.

COMMUNITY NEWS

"Community News" is a newspaper distributed by Lincoln Public Schools, free to all elementary students the first week of every month from September through May. "Community News" replaces most informational flyers and can be used as a guide to community activities for students. The monthly school lunch menu is included in each issue of "Community News."

SCHOOL WEBSITE

Information is regularly updated on our website: *pershing.LPS.org.*

PARENTVUE

Parents may access communications, attendance information and more for their child through ParentVue. A "button" linking you to ParentVue can be found on our school website.

VISITORS

Parents/guardians and community members are encouraged to visit school. Children not enrolled at Pershing may not visit unless accompanied by an adult. It is recommended that visitors limit their visit to 30 minutes. If wanting to visit the classroom please make arrangements with the Teacher before hand. When visitors do come to school, we ask that they come to the office, sign in using the computer and wear the badge provided for you. Wearing this badge will assure all staff that approval has been given by the office to visit. This is an important step in our security plan.

PETS AT SCHOOL

Pets are an important part of many students' lives and can provide many good learning experiences. The teacher or principal must approve a visit by a pet in advance. **During arrival and dismissal no pets are allowed on school grounds.**

REPORTING ABSENCES

If your child is unable to attend school, call the office at (402) 436-1160 or enter absences on ParentVue. If the school has not been notified, a call will be made to your home or work. If you can't be reached, emergency contacts will be called.

MAKE-UP WORK

We appreciate parent/guardians' conscientious regard for picking up homework for their child.

- If your child will be absent only one day, work may be made up or taken home upon return to school.
- If your child will be absent for an extended period of time, please contact the classroom teacher to plan for completion of work and notify the office.

Please call the school in the morning to request homework to be picked up after school.

PARENT TEACHER ORGANIZATION

The Pershing Parent Teacher Organization (PPTO) is a vital part of Pershing's success with children. As an organization, they represent parents/guardians and organize events and projects that serve children and families. Scheduled PPTO meetings are listed on the calendar. All teachers and families are encouraged to attend PPTO meetings and activities.

BULLYING

If you feel that your child is being bullied by peers, please contact your child's teacher or the building principal. All reported incidences of bullying/unsafe behavior will follow the protocol outlined in Lincoln Public Schools Board Policy 5482: Anti-Bullying Policy.

Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior among school aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. The behavior is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time.

In order to be considered bullying, the behavior must include:

- Imbalance of Power: Kids who bully use their power—such as physical strength, access to embarrassing information, or popularity—to control or harm others. Power imbalances can change over time and in different situations, even if they involve the same people.
- Repetition: Bullying behaviors happen more than once or have the potential to happen more than once.
- Hurtful aggressive physical and/or verbal behavior.

Bullying includes actions such as making threats, spreading rumors, attacking someone physically or verbally, and excluding someone from a group on purpose.

As an added prevention piece, please discuss with your child adults in the building who they can talk to if they feel that they are being bullied or are in an unsafe situation. These people may include, but are not limited to, their teacher, the administrator, school counselor, school psychologist, school social worker or any other adult in the building that they have built a positive relationship with.

Students are taught about what bullying looks like and sounds like, along with how to advocate for themselves through the District's Second Step program.

COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTER (CLC)-YMCA

CLC services are available between 7:00-8:00 a.m. and after school until 5:30 p.m. on school days. Pre-registration is required, call: 402-434-9262.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS AND ACTIVITIES

Throughout the school year, a variety of interest clubs and activities are sponsored by the Pershing Community Learning Center. Club and registration information will be sent home with students. Additional activities available to students (some for only designated grade levels) include: Chorus, Band, and Orchestra. Other clubs and activities may be organized to address special interests of students and staff.

Pershing Elementary School TITLE I PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT POLICY 2024-2025 SCHOOL VEAR

Pershing Elementary intends to follow the Title I Parent and Family Engagement Policy guidelines in accordance with federal law, Section 1116(a - f) ESSA, (Every Student Succeeds Act) of 2015.
